



## Using our Intelcom Video Clip Repository

We now have a subscription to a digital video clip repository that will allow us to search for and link to professionally-produced video clips. The subject matter covered by these videos is growing, but there are already collections in environmental science, U.S. history, biology, anatomy, earth sciences, child development, sociology, philosophy, health, oceanography, political science, psychology and more.

You can place these links on your web pages, in your classroom PowerPoint presentations, or in your online course. These videos are professionally produced, provide [closed captioning](#) and represent a broad range of subject matter. The students don't need any username or password, either, so it's easy as can be.

### Getting Started

1. Go to [www.intelecomonline.net](http://www.intelecomonline.net) .
2. Enter your username and password: [Click here](#) to send an e-mail requesting the username and password.
3. You'll see a page with three columns: "Academic Discipline," "Course" and "Clips." Intelcom calls this page their "Search Center."
4. I have found the most useful way to browse the collection is to view the selection by "Academic Discipline" rather than "Course." Click on one of the "Academic Disciplines" and wait for the collection of video clips to load. (You'll see the clips in the right-most column.)
5. Click on a clip title to select it. You'll see its thumbnail image, title and run time, as well as a brief description of the video clip. Click on "Play Clip" in order to start watching.
6. Once you have watched a clip, you can return to the main search window by clicking on the "Return to Search Center" button.

### Collecting Your Favorite Clips

As you start finding video clips that you'd like to be able to revisit or use, you should begin adding them to your "My Clips" collection. After viewing any clip, one of the options is to "Save to My Clips." The first time you do so, you'll be asked to create a username and password. Thereafter, you'll be able to access your clips by clicking on the "My Clips" tab at the top of the "Search Center."

### Using your Clips with your Students

Upon viewing a clip, you'll see the option to "Copy to My Course." Click there and you'll see a window open with a special address that your students may use to view the video. They won't have to search or enter any passwords. Simply copy that URL to your webpage, PowerPoint presentation, or online course.
